

Reverend Monsignor Joseph R. Chapel, ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Newark in 1992, has been appointed Director of Formation for Permanent Diaconate, effective July 1, 2021, while remaining as Pastor of

Monsignor Chapel earned an M.A. in International Relations from the Paul S. Nitze

School for Advanced International Studies (SAIS), The Johns Hopkins University; an S.T.B. from The Pontifical Gregorian University, Rome; an S.T.L. and an S.T.D. from the Accademia Alfonsiana, Lateran University, Rome. His doctoral dissertation is entitled, "Why Confess Our Sins Out Loud? An Analysis Based on the Dialogical Philosophy Ferdinand Ebner in Light of the Philosophy of Language and Symbolic Sacramentology of Louis-Marie Chauvet." His publications include: Editor, Ferdinand Ebner, The Word and the Spiritual Realities (Catholic University of America Press, 2021); "Why Confess Our Sins Out Loud? Some Possibilities Based on the Thought of Ferdinand Ebner and Louis-Marie Chauvet" (Irish Theological "Dialogical Personalism *Ouarterly*); Revisited" (Studia Moralia) and "Philosophy as Preparation for Sacramental Theology and Moral Life" (Seminary Journal). Monsignor Chapel taught Moral Theology, Reconciliation & **Anointing** and Preaching Practicum for many

years at Immaculate Conception Seminary School of Theology, and served the Seminary in various other roles as mentor, spiritual director, confessor, Associate Dean, member of the theological faculty of the Pastoral Provision, Co-Director of the Institute for Christian Spirituality and Director of the Center for Diaconal Formation. He continues to serve as Adjunct Spiritual Director and Adjunct Professor of Theology.

In Spring 2009, Monsignor Chapel was named Chaplain to His Holiness the with title of Monsignor. In 2014, he was appointed Spiritual Director of the Casa Santa Maria, Pontifical North American College, in Rome. In 2017, he was named Pastor of Our Lady of Mercy Parish, Park Ridge, NJ until his recent assignment to Saint Andrew's in February, 2020.

Union County Deacons Meet

On the warm summer morning of Saturday, June 26th. Bishop Elias R. Lorenzo, O.S.B. V.G. gathered the permanent



deacons of Union County.

This was the second gathering of Union County deacons called by Bishop Elias, since becoming the auxiliary bishop of Union County. The hosting parish was St. Elizabeth of Hungary in Linden. The deacons were grateful to the hosting pastor, Fr. Edgardo Jocson and DeaconJohn Bejgrowicz for their hospitality.

Bishop Elias opened with a prayer, followed by an introduction of the keynote speaker, Father Edwin

each deacon to introduce himself, so he could get to know us better.

Fr. Edwin began by explaining that the task of preaching the Good News of Jesus Christ is a proclamation with our lives and being open to others, to love the other person, the way the person is, without judgment. Fr. Edwin then read the passage of Moses's encounter with the burning bush in Exodus chapter 3. Moses was having an ordinary day, tending the sheep...doing what everyday...then suddenly encounters of the mystery of the Divine Presence. We live in a world where "type A" personalities are encouraged/rewarded... and we can easily miss the burning bushes in our lives, if we don't take the time to investigate. The Divine Presence is revealed to us in Jesus Christ. We must allow the fire of Divine love to purify us, so we can announce the Good News.

Fr. Edwin then read the passage of the gospel of Matthew on the Transfiguration of Jesus. Peter, James and John saw the glorified Jesus... got a glimpse of God's presence. Fr. Edwin told the deacons to make sure you have time in your diaconal life to have the Lord take you aside, to encounter the mystery of the Divine Presence.

You must "unrubble" your lives. Allow the Lord to lead you up the mountain. The Divine love of our Lord Jesus Christ will transform your heart. We are to love the other person in the dimension of the cross. Love transforms, we don't. Allow yourself to be caught up in the Presence of God. Share the Presence of God in you with others.


What do monks do all day? Fr. Edwin said that living the Christian life is "falling down and getting up". They waste time together in God's Presence.

Fr. Edwin described how we transmit our faith, not religion...by love and communion, where communion is accepting each other as we are. This happens because of the power of the Holy Spirit at work in us.

Following Fr. Edwin's talk, Deacon Michael York and Deacon David Farrell explained their role as members of the Archdiocese Council, Deacon serving the deacons of Union County. All County Union deacons encouraged to communicate their concerns, recommendations etc. to Deacon Mike and Deacon Dave.

Bishop Elias led the deacons in Midday Prayer, concluding the gathering of deacons.

Deacon Paul Kliauga



Paul Kliauga of Tinton Falls, NJ. entered eternal life on Sat, May 22. He was 86 years old. Paul was born in Chicago Il, received a BS degree at the

University of Chicago, and moved to NY, where he raised a family and earned a PhD in physics at NYU.

Deacon Paul went on to become a professor and researcher in Particle Physics at Columbia University.

Paul became a deacon of the Catholic Church for service to the Archdiocese of Newark being ordained on June 5, 1999.

A devout Christian and a philanthropist, he always gave of himself, and will be sorely missed by all who knew and loved him.

He is survived by his wife Mary and son David.

A Funeral Mass was be celebrated on May 27, at Holy Innocents Roman Catholic Church followed by Entombment at St. Anne Cemetery located in Wall Township.
