In order to make a gift of securities, please alert us in advance.

Gifts cannot be properly acknowledged or designated without advance notice of who is making the gift, its designation, and the number of shares being transferred.

A wire transfer can be made through the Depositary Trust Corporation (DTC) to our brokerage account. You will need the following information:
